Easter is one of those events which shatters all of our preconceptions, and gives us a new way of viewing the world. It spells opportunity, and it is never-ending! It is all about change!

A contemporary Christian writer in England notes: *"There is little good in filling churches with people who go out exactly the same way as they came in."* It's a waste of your time, not to mention mine, and not to mention God's, if you leave church exactly as you were when you arrive. Something has to happen to you to make a difference in your lives, and you can't wait to die for it to happen.

Where the world tells us to hate, we can choose to love, what ever the cost. Where the world tells us to stand pat, we can move on, wherever we are to go. Where the world tells us to be prudent, fearful, and cautious, we can be brave and foolish and courageous, not matter what. When our own inner voice tells us that we are dirt, we can plant bulbs and watch them bloom. ## MAY BUCKET CHANGE - LAUREL HOUSE

Laurel House was founded in 1985 by two women who were distraught at the sight of teenagers living on the streets of Orange County, California. What began as an emergency crisis shelter for teenage runaways has evolved over the years into a unique, proactive, preventive program for teens at risk of becoming homeless due to tense family situations at home. Before a teenage girl reaches that crisis point where she feels she has no other alternative but to run away, she can come live at Laurel House for six months to one year for a safe and structured "cooling off" period from her parents. Their goals are to provide a temporary, safe home for the teens, properly diagnose and treat for any existing disorders, keep them in school, achieve academic success, and ultimately reunify the teens with their families or find an alternative resolution if reunification is not possible.

### Why Laurel House Works

The key to the success of Laurel House is in its uniquely-designed program:

- Live-in family at the home instead of staff rotating in shifts
- Longer length of stay – 6 months to one year
- Individual therapy and Family therapy
- Cooperation of the entire family
- Christian home environment
